Dear Westbridge Parents,

Welcome Back to a New School Year 2022-2023!

We, the Teachers and Staff of PAREF-Westbridge School, are very happy to welcome back the Parents and their sons in our Face-to-Face Classes as we hold our Blended Learning Program for the first semester of this school year.

We also warmly welcome our 43 new students, including 6 returning students and 257 continuing students for a total school population of **300** students this school year. We would like to welcome also three returning teachers – Mr. Greg Descarial, Mr. Jenio Bermudo and Mr. Dennis Adolacion together with five new teachers

The school has prepared well for the safe resumption of face-to-face classes by fulfilling all the directives of the Department of Education and has been granted approval last June 17, 2022 to hold a limited Face-to-Face classes through our Blended Learning Program. A Memorandum from the Department of Education released last week, July 11, 2022, has directed all Basic Education Schools in the country to hold full Face-to-Face classes by November of this year. Westbridge will now prepare for the school to be ready for a 100% Face-to-Face classes by the second semester this coming November 14, 2022.

In order to ensure the safety of everyone during Face-to-Face classes, we will follow the minimum health protocols against Covid-19. Face masks must be worn by all the students, Faculty and Staff while holding In-Person classes in the school premises. I am sure that our Blended Learning Program allows us of improving much the delivery of quality PAREF Education now that In-Person classes are allowed.

The RFID of the students will be available once we get all their digital pictures by the first week of August. The PAREF IT who has provided us with the Shared IT Services have also activated the Health Badge for each student in the PAREF-Westbridge Account of the parents. You may use this as an alternative to filling-up the Health Declaration Google Form provided by your class advisers.

The following school officers are reappointed to their respective positions as Principals of the different Grade Levels: Mr. Lowell Rublico – Principal of Elementary (Grades 1-6), Mr. Rey Besana – Principal of Junior High School (Grades 7-10); and Mr. Bryan Tagabe – Principal of Senior High School (Grades 11-12).

Lastly, we will be informing you soon on your son's mentor and the list of new or continuing Parent Coordinators, our greatest allies. Please give them your all out support and feel free to approach them or your principals for any suggestion or school concern.
